
Academic Programmatic Review – Remote Visit

- 11. Keystones can be used for the portfolio for those students who need a portfolio for good cause promotion.
 12. Only students who need portfolio for good cause promotion will take the standards-based multiple-choice assessments. The Student Assessment and Research Department is working to provide the least amount assessments to cover the necessary standards as possible. These standards-based assessments will be available in Spring 2020.
