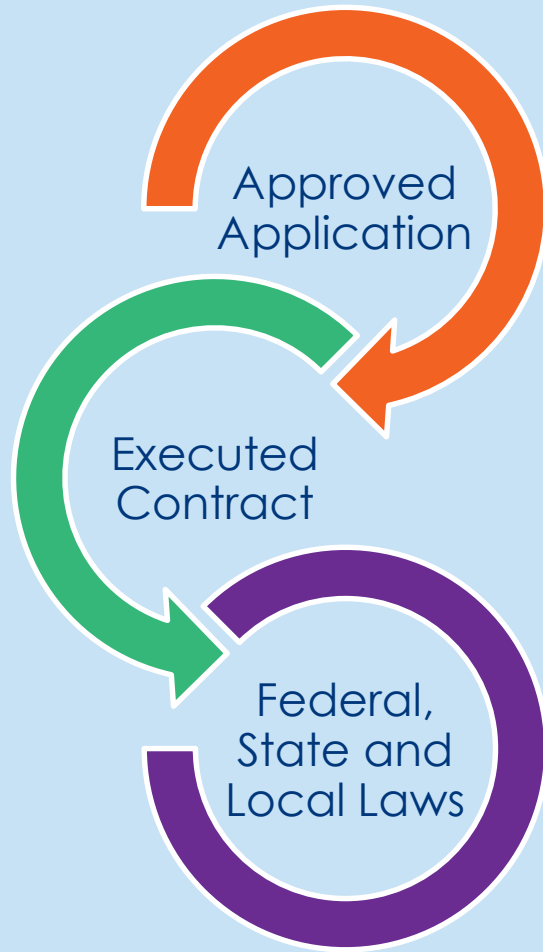

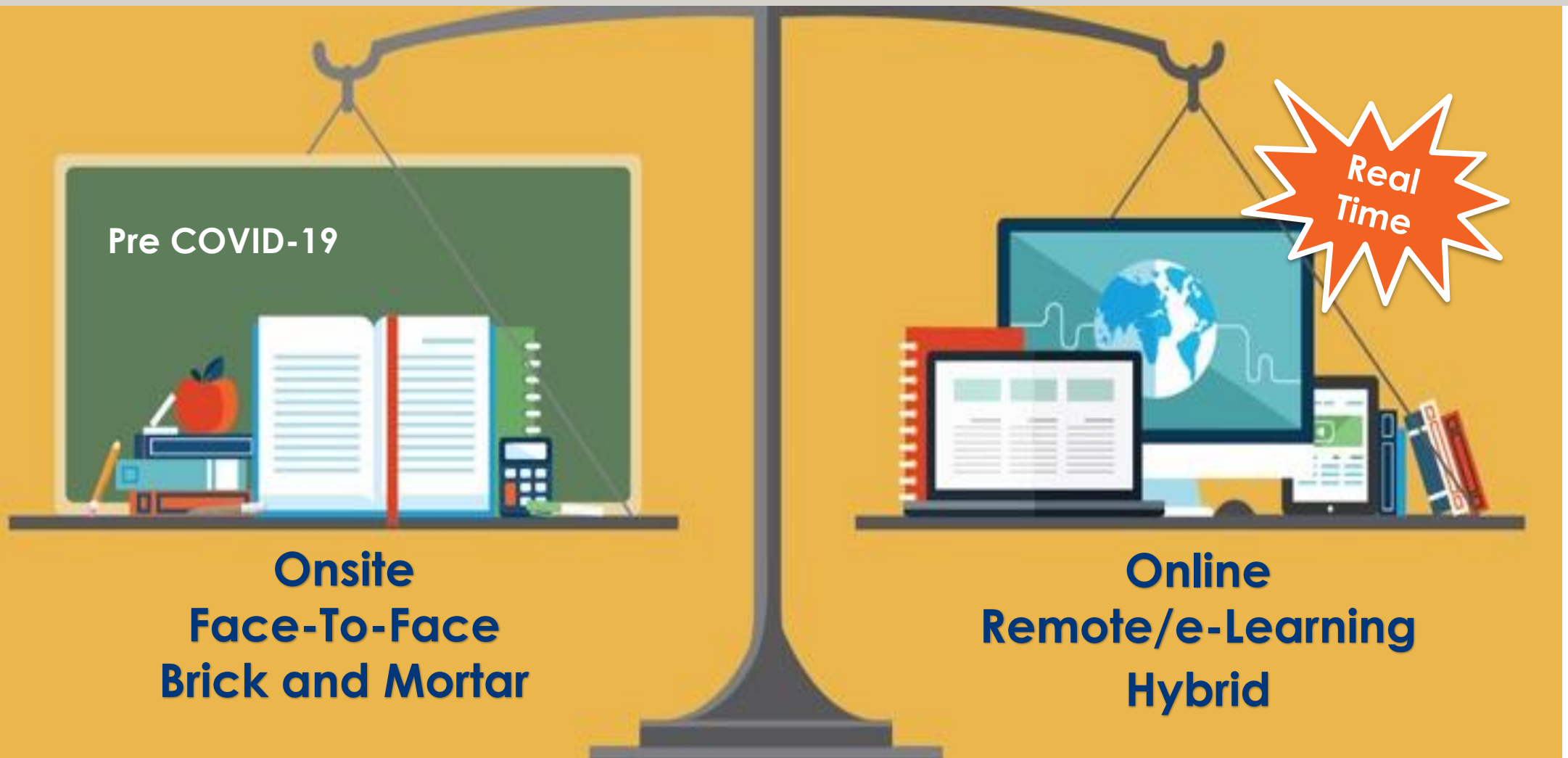
Academic Programmatic Review – Remote Visit

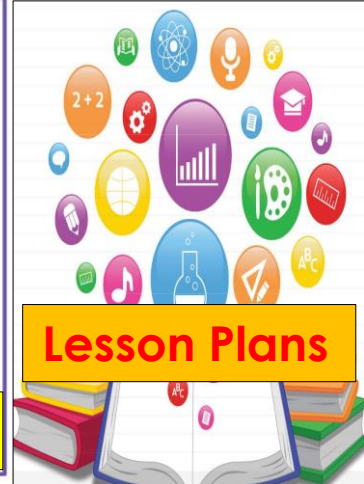
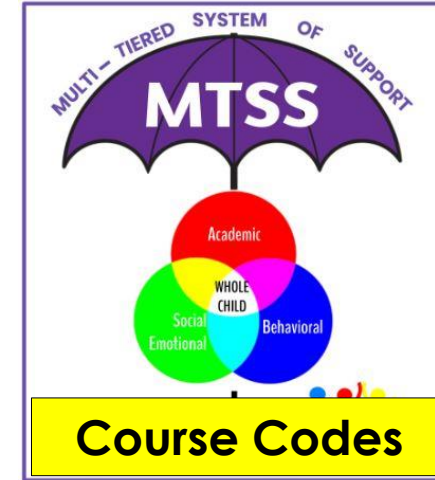

SUBJECT: **THIRD GRADE KEYSTONES AND PORTFOLIO UPDATE**

ACTION REQUIRED

2020-2021 MEMO

ACTION: Please share this memo regarding revisions to the Third Grade Keystones and Portfolio for the 19-20 school year with all third-grade teachers. The eight (8) revised Third Grade Keystones will be posted in the Elementary Learning Canvas Course by Wednesday, June 5, 2019. Charter schools will receive the Keystones via the Sharepoint/One Drive folder with email notification. Additional guidance regarding the Third Grade Keystones will be provided at the beginning of August 2019. We welcome feedback on the revised Keystones and Portfolio through the Elementary Learning Department's feedback link:

Revisions to the Third Grade Keystones and the Portfolio include the following:

1. The number of standards assessments per Keystone have been reduced to no more than four (4) per Keystone.
2. Standards that are better assessed through multiple-choice have been removed from all Keystones.
3. The passages used for the Keystones have been revised and/or replaced to better meet the requirements outlined in the standards and align to the state.
4. Only one product is required per Keystone. Multiple products to meet the various standards have been eliminated.
5. Optional products are available and can be used, i.e., teachers can use the optional product or select from an alternative product, or determine a product of their own.
6. Multiple-choice items have been removed from the Keystones.
7. The individual Student Records have been eliminated. An optional excel spreadsheet is available to track student performance by standard for each Keystone.
8. The Student Rubrics were revised and reduced in number of pages from four (4) to one (1).
9. Student Directions are now included as part of the Student Rubric to ensure alignment to teacher directions and fit on one side of the paper.
10. Guidance is being provided explicitly explaining the implementation of Keystones for a consistent understanding across the District.
11. Keystones can be used for the portfolio for those students who need a portfolio for good cause promotion.
12. Only students who need portfolio for good cause promotion will take the standards-based multiple-choice assessments. The Student Assessment and Research Department is working to provide the least amount assessments to cover the necessary standards as possible. These standards-based assessments will be available in Spring 2020.

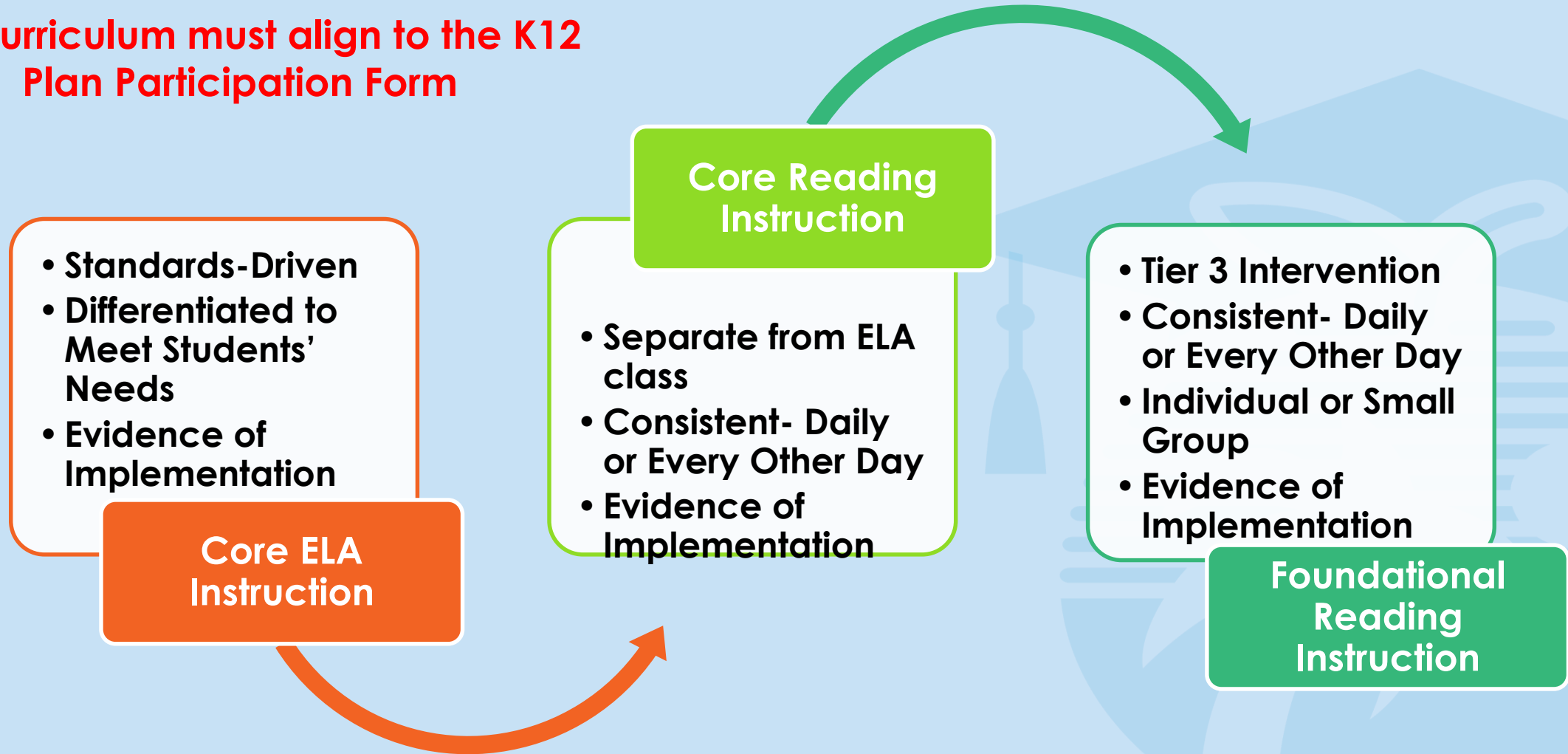
