
Authorizing in Colorado & Lessons Learned

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QUICK FACTS ABOUT COLORADO'S CHARTER SCHOOL LANDSCAPE



- The first charter school in Colorado opened in 1993.
- Over 260 charter schools across the state that serve more than 130,000 students.
- Charter schools enroll roughly 15% of the total public school population in Colorado.
- Charter schools in Colorado can be authorized by either local school districts or the Colorado Charter School Institute, a statelevel authorizer.
- The majority of charter schools are authorized by local districts.
- Governed by the Colorado Charter Schools Act.





- Approximately 40% of K-12 students qualify for free or reducedprice lunch.
- About 16% of students are identified as English language learners.
- Roughly 10% of students receive special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

Charter school students in Colorado are **more diverse** on average than our traditional public-school peers.




Small School Subsidizing

Subsidizing schools operating under capacity and can lead to formulaic school closure decisions








